Agenda for 73rd Session of Council

Public Meeting – Cliffside Development Zoning and Official Plan Amendments – William Street

The proposed amendment applications apply to 12-20 William Street in Odessa. The proposal is to redesignate the lands from Commercial and Low Density Residential to Medium Density Residential to facilitate the development of three 3-storey Stacked Row Dwelling Condominiums. A recommendation report will be brought forward to Council once comments have been addressed.

Employee Electronic Monitoring Policy

A by-law to adopt an Employee Electronic Monitoring Policy. The policy is required as part of the amendments made to the Ontario Employment Standards Act with the passing of the Working for Workers Act.

Amherst Island Ferry: New Ferry Commissioning Update

Council received an information report that provided an update on the current status of the new ferry commissioning, results of the discussions with the Minister's Office and MTO and reasons for the delay in service implementation.

Bath Connecting Link Intake 8 – Municipal Support for Application

Council supported an application to the Connecting Link funding program for the design, field investigation and tender documents preparation for the road sections of Main Street, Bath – Centennial Park easterly to the eastern limit of the Highway 33 Connecting Link.

Housekeeping Amendments Recommendation Report

Following a public meeting that was held on September 26, 2022, By-law 2022-092 was enacted and passed that addresses several zoning housekeeping matters.

Acquisition of Land – 106 County Rd 4, Bath

Council passed a by-law confirming the acquisition of land from Rankin Construction Inc., described as Pt Lt 19 Con Broken Front Ernestown Pt 1 29R4891; Loyalist Township (106 County Rd 4).

Increased Fines for Speeding

Council supported a resolution circulated from the Municipality of Grey Highlands calling on municipalities to lobby the Ministry of the Solicitor General to increase the fines for all levels of speeding.
